- Population and Reproductive Health: 30 years
- Cairo, Beijing
- Youth reproductive and sexual health: 2000 2015
- Maternal Health: 2000 to date
- o Capstone Phase: 2015-2018/2020



Achievements

Recognition – Policy – Improved Indicators

- Maternal mortality = national health priority (2000-2012)
- Public policy
- o Decline in MMR
- Adolescent unwanted pregnancy prevention = national priority (current president)
- Public policy

Capstone Phase: Professional Midwifery in Mexico

- Commitment
- Rights and equality
- Opportunity
- Challenge



Despite its stated interest, Mexico has yet to devise a clear pathway toward developing a new cadre of professional midwives and requires support from civil society. Civil society organizations can, among other things, help generate positive public opinion; represent the needs and demands of women; create, document and evaluate new models for training or deployment to generate best practices; bring in lessons from other countries; diversify leadership; engage new stakeholders; and provide technical and political support.

Joint priority setting & 3-year goals: Education

- Expand training opportunities/increase licensed midwives
- Increase recognition of midwifery as a profession, and understanding of what professional midwifery entails
- Establish core curriculum for Mexico

Joint priority setting & 3-year goals: Deployment

- Increase and diversify work opportunities
- Develop strategies for integrating midwives into the system and linking autonomous midwives to system
- Clinics and hospitals should have a clear understanding of the work midwives should be doing, and both allow them to do this work, and monitor that they are doing it.

Joint priority setting & 3-year goals: Policy

- National Strategy
- Legal and normative proposals
- National and state level public reports
- Earmarked funding for educating and hiring midwives

Joint priority setting & 3-year goals: Leadership and Communications

- Visible, coherent and unifying messages
- Increased media coverage
- Midwives are more empowered and knowledgeable about advocacy and strategy
- Improved networking within and across sector
- Information available to women and communities
