




Travelers' Concerns About H1N1 and Seasonal Fluwhile Traveling

% saying very or somewhat concerned they or member of family will get sick with H1N1 flu or seasonal flu while traveling in next 12 months...




Travelers' Intent to Take Flu Precautions for Themselves While Traveling

Likelihood of taking precautions to keep <u>themselves</u> healthy from H1N1 or seasonal flu while traveling this year




Likelihood of taking these precautions this year compared to last year*




Likelihood of taking precautions to keep <u>others</u> healthy from H1N1 or seasonal flu while traveling this year

Travelers' Efforts to Reduce Chances of Getting Sick from H1N1 or Seasonal Flu on their Last Trip*





Travelers' Experiences Traveling* While Sick Coughing and Sneezing with Fever in the Past Year



Travelers' Willingness to Delay or Cancel Next Trip* if Sick With and Without Fever


% saying if got sick, coughing and sneezing...


Travelers' Intentions to Get H1N1 Flu Vaccine Before their Next Trip


Travelers' Intentions to Get Seasonal Flu Vaccine Before their Next Trip







Seen posters in security checkpoints/boarding areas of airports, bus and train terminals, and cruise ports


Seen posters <u>outside of security checkpoints/boarding</u> <u>areas</u> of airports, bus and train terminals, and cruise ports

Seen or heard public health advertising other than posters concerning staying healthy from flu while traveling






Travelers' Exposure to Posters About Staying Healthy from Flu while Traveling in Bus Terminals*




Travelers' Exposure to Posters on Staying Healthy from Flu while Traveling in Cruise Ports*

Methods Summary

- Telephone poll (including both landline and cell phone)
- Conducted November 12-18, 2009
- Nationally representative random sample of travelers, defined as adults in the United States who have traveled by airplane, bus, train, or cruise ship in the past 12 months
- 1124 respondents
- Data weighted to match U.S. Census on: gender, age, race, education, and region, accounting for traveler status
