

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE OR USE OF LIQUID SILICONE FOR THE PURPOSE OF INJECTION INTO THE HUMAN BODY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in _____:

Section 1. (NEW) (Effective *January 1, 20XX*) *Insert in public health/welfare/crimes/penal code title*

(a) For the purposes of this section:

(1) "Liquid silicone" means silicone oil that is a liquid polymer of siloxane and does not include silicone inflatable breast prosthesis, as defined at 21 CFR 878.3530, or silicone gel-filled breast prosthesis, as defined at 21 CFR 878.3540.

(b) Except for use in the treatment of retinal detachment, it is unlawful for a person to:

(1) Inject any liquid silicone into the human body;

(2) Sell or offer for sale in this state, through any methods, any liquid silicone for the purpose of injection into the human body;

(3) Sell or offer for sale to those residing outside of this state, through any methods, any liquid silicone for the purpose of injection into the human body; and

(4) Sell or offer for sale, under any circumstances, any liquid silicone without requiring the purchaser to sign a written or electronic statement that reads "I acknowledge and understand that it is unlawful to use this product of liquid silicone for the purpose of injection into the human body except for the treatment retinal detachment, which shall be performed only by a licensed health care professional authorized to perform such procedure under controlling state or federal law".

(c) Any person that violates this section is guilty of a *insert misdemeanor/felony within crimes/penal code title*.

Statement of Purpose:

To prohibit any person from the sale or use of liquid silicone for the purpose of injection into the human body.
